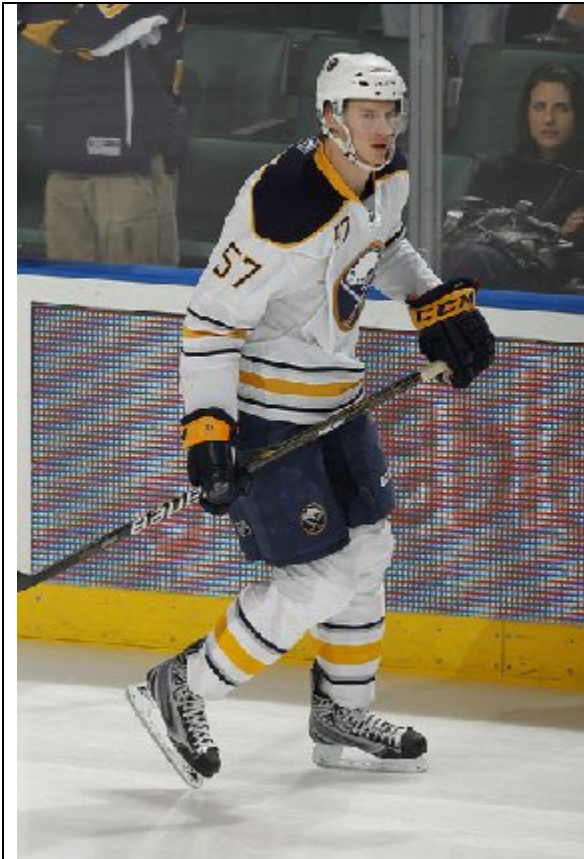

Mrs. Audrey Jachym, widow of **John Jachym**, a 2000 CSHOF inductee, has recently donated one of John's scrapbooks to the CSHOF. Among his many accomplishments, Mr. Jachym, a native of South Dayton, NY, was once a part-owner of the Washington Senators in 1950 before selling his shares to Clark Griffith. In 1994 he was the recipient of the Professional Golfers Association's highest award, an honorary membership. The scrapbook chronicles John's tenure as the owner of the class D minor league Jamestown Falcons, 1946-1948.

# INDUCTEE OF THE MONTH



## **Mark Hammond**

Dunkirk resident Mark Hammond was a football official 42 years, basketball official 33 years and baseball umpire 20 years. He was business manager of the Jamestown Falcons of the PONY League 1946-47 and general manager of Lockport of PONY League 1948. He then became general manager of Olean in PONY League 1950-51.

From 1947-49 he was general manager of the Tri-City Black Hawks and Syracuse Nationals of the National Basketball

League.

Back to baseball, he was general business manager of the International League's Buffalo Bisons in the early 1950s and was a major league scout for the Washington Senators, Kansas City A's and St. Louis Cardinals.

In 1967 he managed the New York State Babe Ruth League Championship team from Dunkirk.

Mark Hammond was inducted into the Chautauqua Sports Hall of Fame in its very first class, 1982. He died in 1990.
