2025 CSHOF Legacy Society Awards





The Bill Rollinger and Tony LeVoie Legacy Award will be given in honor of two outstanding swim coaches. Rollinger, a 1996 CSHOF inductee, was well-known for his success at Jamestown High School while LeVoie, a 1985 CSHOF inductee, is remembered for his work at the Jamestown Boys' Club. The Rollinger and LeVoie Award will be given to an

Outstanding Male High School Swimmer, Conner Dean, from Jamestown High School.

The Julie (Gawronski) Tickle Legacy Award honors the accomplishments of the 2016 CSHOF inductee who excelled at Dunkirk High and Union College in both soccer and softball. The Tickle Award will be presented to an Outstanding Female Multisport High School Athlete, Ava Jimerson, from Frewsburg Central School.





The James A. Sharp Legacy Award honors the memory of the former Parks and Recreation Director for the City of Jamestown. The Sharp Award will be presented to an Outstanding Contributor and Volunteer in Chautauqua County, Dan Stone from Jamestown.

The Ken Martin Legacy Award honors the 1997 CSHOF inductee who is arguably one of the finest baseball and softball players in Chautauqua County history. The Martin Award will be presented to an Outstanding High School Baseball Player, Ashton Putney, from Fredonia High School.





The Tom Prechtl Legacy Award honors the former four-sport Fredonia Central star who went on to play basketball at Niagara University. The Prechtl Award will be presented to an Outstanding Male Multi-sport High School Athlete, Bryce Hinsdale from Clymer/Sherman/Panama.



The Jack Keeney Legacy Award honors the 2015 CSHOF inductee who was a beloved teacher, coach and administrator at Panama Central School. The Keeney Award will be given to two Outstanding Student-Athletes at Panama. Tate Catanese and Kaitlyn Horton will be the 2025 recipients.

The Anthony "Dony" Deppas Legacy Award honors the memory of the well-known sports enthusiast and player from Jamestown. The Deppas Award will be presented to an Outstanding Male High School Basketball Player in the county, Carson Swanson from Westfield Central School.






The Mel Swanson Legacy Award honors the former basketball coach at Sherman Central who retired with the most victories in Chautauqua County history. The Swanson Award, presented to an Outstanding Female Basketball Player in the county will be given to Jadyn Trocki from Frewsburg Central School.

The Nelson Turnell Legacy Award will be presented in honor of a member of the CSHOF's very first inductee class. Turnell was known throughout the area as a first-rate player, an excellent coach and a man who loved the sport of tennis. The Turnell Award will be given to the Outstanding Male High School Tennis Player, Jackson Spangler from Fredonia Central School.





The William "Bill" Short Legacy Award honors Bill Short, a 1963 graduate of Fredonia High School. The Short Award will be given to two Outstanding Student-Athletes from Fredonia, Luca Gullo and Elizabeth Morris.



The Ted Olsen and Bill Present
Legacy Award will be given in honor
of two outstanding athletes from
Jamestown High School in the 1940s.
Ted Olsen, a 1999 CSHOF inductee
was noted for his prowess on the JHS
gridiron, while Present a 2006 CSHOF
inductee, starred on the hardwood at
JHS. The Olsen and Present Award will
be given to the Oustanding Male and
Female Student-Athletes at Jamestown.
Conner Dean and Emily Cardinale
will be the 2025 recipients.

The Sirianni Family Legacy Award honors CSHOF inductee Fran Sirianni, his wife, Amy, and his three sons, Mike, Jay and Nick. The Siriannis are well-known for their impressive accomplishments in football and track and field, the latter a sport Fran coached at Southwestern Central for nearly 40 years. The Sirianni Award will recognize an Outstanding High School Track and Field Athlete in Chautauqua County, Ethan Verbosky of Maple Grove Central School.





The Dr. Charles E. Sinatra Legacy Award honors a man who is known nationwide for his remarkable ability to build and restore championship winning antique cars and motorcycles, but who quietly, behind-the scenes, and without seeking attention or thanks, has volunteered and supported sports and a wide-variety of other community activities to better the quality of life in Chautauqua County. The 2025 recipient of the Sinatra Award as an unsung hero of sports is **John Lamb** from Jamestown.

The President's Legacy Award will be given by Randy Anderson to a member of the CSHOF Board of Directors who has performed Outstanding Service to the CSHOF. The recipient will be announced at the picnic.





The Cal Cederquist Legacy Award honors the 2013 CSHOF inductee who was a highly successful cross-country and track and field coach at Chautauqua Central School and later at Chautauqua Lake Central School. The Cederquist Award honors an Outstanding Track and Field Student-Athlete at Chautauqua Lake Central. The 2025 recipient is Jada Cole.

The Stan Marshaus Legacy Award will be given in honor of the 2006 CSHOF inductee who has been a well-known figure in the world of golf in the county, especially with his achievements as pro and director of golf at the Chautauqua Golf Club. The Marshaus Award will be given to the top male high school golfer in Chautauqua County, Evan Steffen, from Maple Grove Central School.





The Women Coaches' Legacy Award will be given in recognition of the important contributions women make in the coaching circles of Chautauqua County. The 2025 "Palmer" award will be given to the outstanding coach at Frewsburg Central School, Sierra Beaver.

The Chuck Crist Eminence Grise Award is given in honor of one of the finest all-around athletes in Western New York history. A standout basketball player at Penn State, Crist transitioned to defensive back and had a seven year NFL career without playing a down of college football. The Crist Award recognizes a powerful decision maker or advisor who operates behind the scenes or in an unofficial capacity in sports in Chautauqua County. The 2025 recipient is the **Doug Hosier**, of Panaama.





The Chip and Mary Beth Johnson Legacy Award recognizes the important role that officials play in sports in Chautauqua County. Chip Johnson, a basketball referee and baseball and softball umpire for many years, as well as the CSHOF Induction Banquet Chairman for over three decades, knows that competent officials ensure fairly played games at all levels of sports. The Johnson Award for 2025 goes to **Norm Thomas** from Jamestown.

The Lyle Peterson Legacy Award honors the memory of the well-known Jamestown businessman and sports enthusiast who had a great love for the sport of ice skating. The Peterson Award is presented to an outstanding contributor(s) to the opportunity, development and growth of ice skating in Chautauqua County. The 2025 honoree is Suzanne Bauth.





The Eric Albin Larson Legacy Award honors the accomplishments of the son of CSHOF Director Fred Larson. Eric was a three-year varsity football player at JHS. He was a starting guard on the undefeated 2000 New York State Class AA Champions. He was the recipient of the 2000 NYS Football Scholar-Athlete Award for large schools. A graduate of Princeton and Vanderbilt, Larson is now a lawyer in Atlanta. The Larson Award will be presented to the most outstanding scholar-athlete on the Jamestown High School Football Team, Carson Panebianco...

The Roger MacTavish Legacy Award was established by IAABO Board #39 to honor its legendary basketball referee of 50+ years and 2011 CSHOF inductee. A guru of the basketball rulebook, MacTavish was a huge proponent of playing the game the "right way" with respect for opponents and officials. The MacTavish Award is presented to a Chautauqua County high school basketball program whose boys' and girls' teams demonstrated outstanding sportsmanship, **Brocton Central**.





The Robert Goold Legacy Award was established to recognize the lifetime work of our 2020 inductee with the intellectually disabled in our county. Goold a well-known educator and coach had a passion for Special Olympics and the athletes who competed in it for nearly 50 years on the local, national and international levels. The 2023 Bob Goold Award is presented to an outstanding contributor to the development and growth of athletic opportunities for the intellectually disabled, **Kevin Anderson** from Jamestown.

The Paul and Martha Cooley Legacy Award was established to honor 2017 CSHOF inductee, Paul, and his late wife, Martha. Paul is a veteran sports official, coach, teacher and community volunteer from the Gerry area. Martha, represents the many spouses and significant others who contribute to the success and longevity of their spouses. The Cooley Award is presented to an outstanding female, multisport athlete at Cassadaga Valley Central School, Emiley Anderson.





The Ramsay Riddell Legacy Award was endowed to honor the late Panama community member Ramsay Riddell an accomplished and enthusiastic athlete and volunteer in the sports of skiing and hockey. It is presented annually to an outstanding contributor to the growth of winter sports in Chautauqua County, Tom McFall from Falconer.
